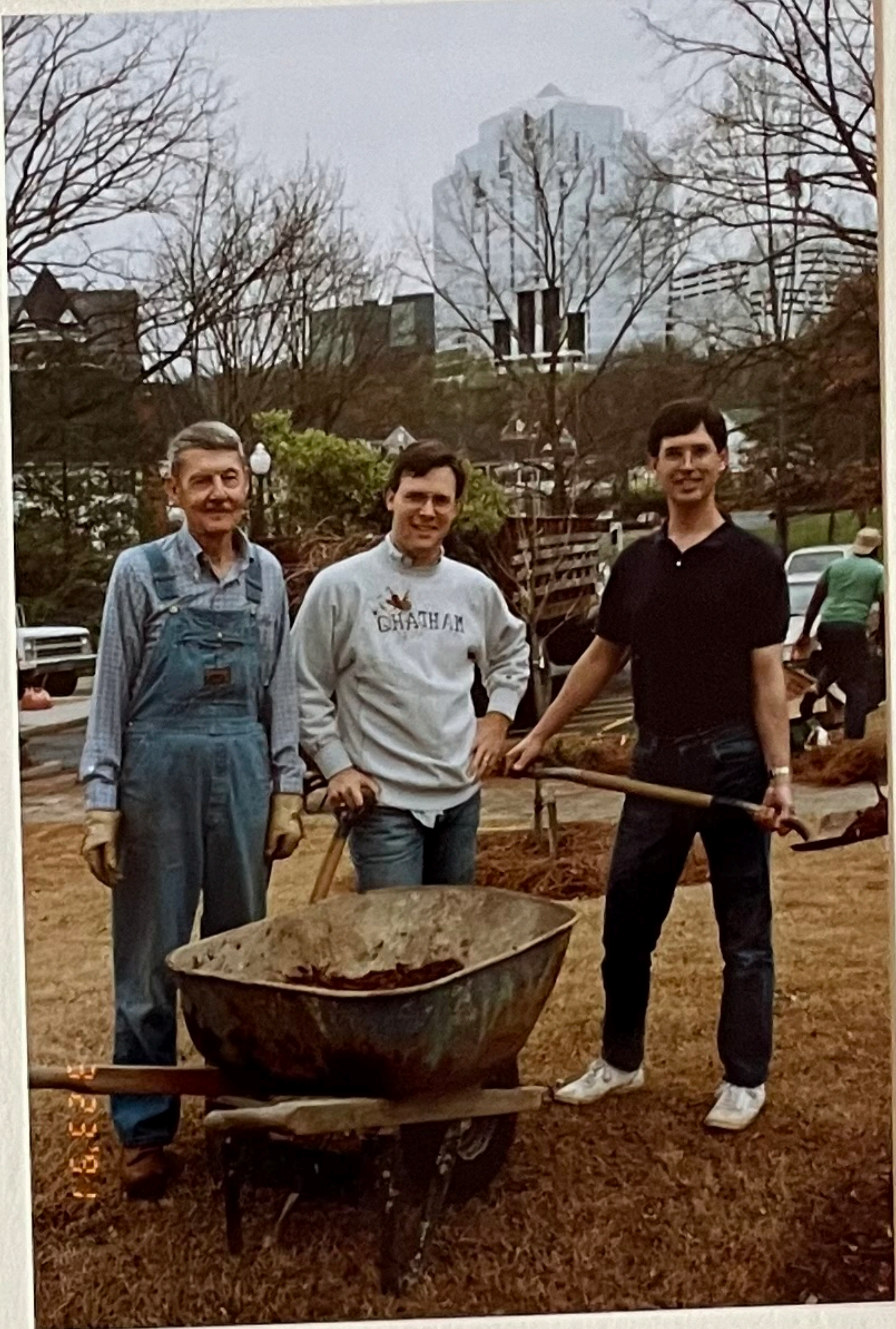

In our first full year of existence as a club, the vocational service committees set a good foundation for their work. In the early part of the year, we initiated an Employee Day where members of our club brought as their guests valuable employees. Many of our members participated to recognize and thank those who are so vital to our own vocational success. As we all know, it is vital for all of us in our vocational lives to adhere strictly to the Four Way Test. With this in mind, we had a program early in the year devoted to this program. Our speaker was a well seasoned Rotarian from another club who is quite committed to this part of Rotary. Every club member received a Four Way Test place card for his or her office.

Our next step was to extend our awareness and development to the community. Our initial involvement was by decision when it was unanimously voted to tie ourselves in with the opening of Vining's first public library, which was built literally within a half-mile of where we met. Being a new club, our funds were understandably limited for vocational service purposes, but we decided to work diligently with the library staff to make available a vocational section of the library where books of vocational interest would be donated and kept. Our monetary contribution to this effort was used to buy incremental reference and check-out books to add to what was to be purchased by the library.

With this initial implementation in place from the Vocational Service section of our Club, we are now activating a long range planning committee to develop ideas that can systematically be implemented to carry our Rotary's Vocational Services ideals given our geography and manpower.

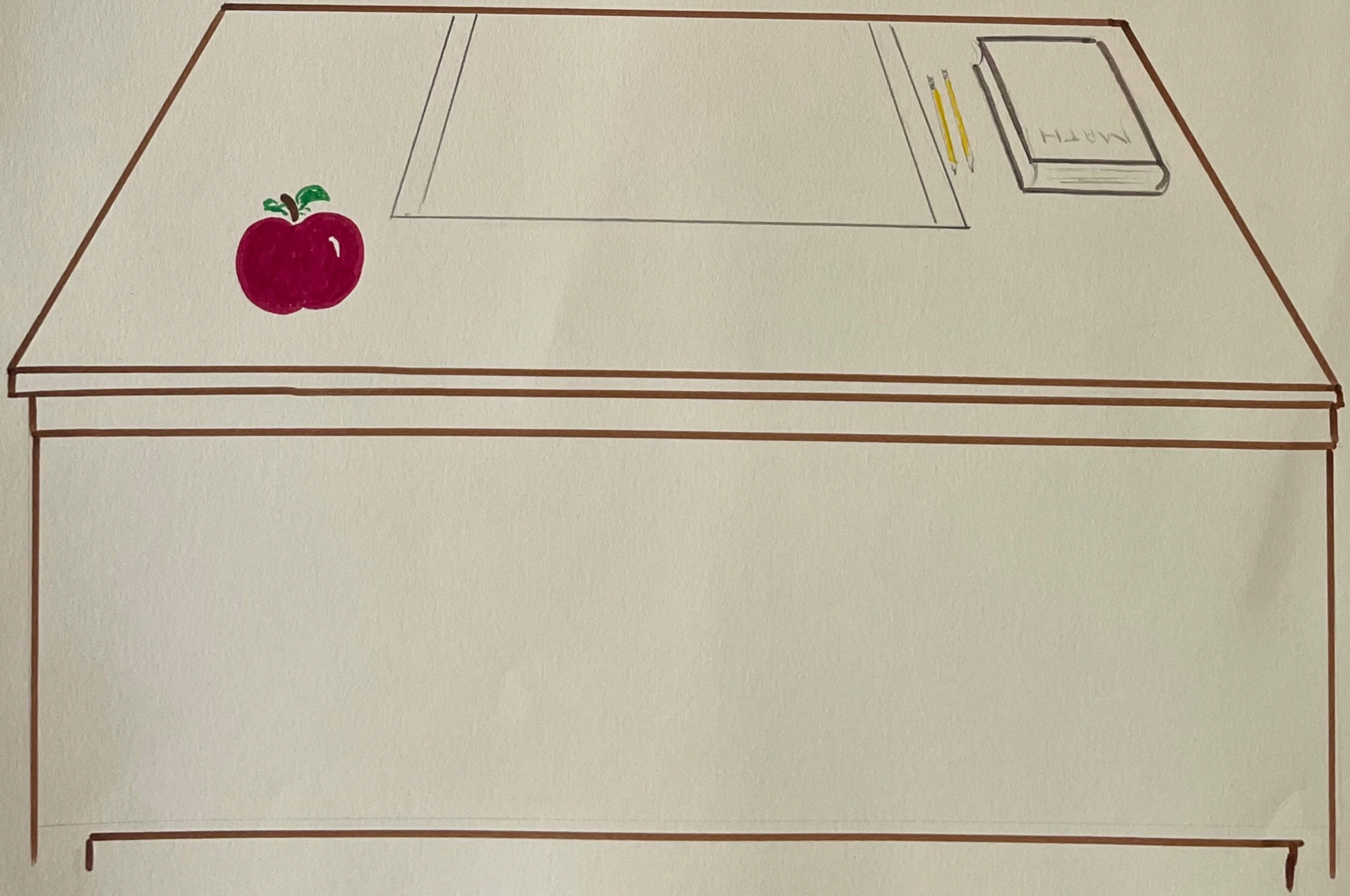
